

The history of the Army is the history of the United States. The Army helped bring the nation into being, explored the new nation, fought wars to protect it, and pioneered innovations in medicine, education, technology, and more. The Army has been in the forefront of preserving and protecting American ideals and institutions since the earliest days of the nation. And, after more than 240 years, it is about to open its only national museum to preserve and share this resonant story.



The National Museum of the United States Army will engage visitors in the rich history of the Army; educate them about the myriad roles the Army has played through the history of our country; inspire pride in



their service for those who have served; and honor the service and individual stories of the men and women who have created and comprise the U.S. Army.

In short, the Museum will tell the story of the Army: the oldest service with the greatest number of members—more than 30 million men and women have worn the uniform since 1775. It will provide meaning and context to Army veterans, their families, and the public and it will help future generations understand how the history of the Army permeates the American experience from its creation and defense, through its early exploration and growth, to its emergence as a great nation and world power.

The Army Historical Foundation is working in a public/private partnership with the Army to make the National Museum of the United States Army a reality. This 185,000 square foot, LEED-certified Museum will be located minutes outside of Washington, DC, on 83.7 acres of publicly-accessible land at Fort Belvoir donated by the Army.

The Foundation broke ground in September 2016 and began construction of the Museum in February of 2017. The first artifacts were installed in August of the same year. With construction proceeding apace, we anticipate the opening of the Museum in 2020.





National Museum of the United States Army Defender's Fund

The **Defender's Fund** is a special donor society designed for those corporations, foundations, or service organizations who wish to financially support the Army's national museum on an annual basis. Fund membership requires a donation of \$5,000 (or more) in a calendar year.

Annual donations to the **Defender's Fund** convey participation and the receipt of corresponding benefits at the following levels:

Defender's Fund Levels	
Colonel-in-Chief	\$45,000
Regimental Commander	\$35,000
Battalion Commander	\$25,000
Company Commander	\$15,000
Platoon Leader	\$10,000
Squad Leader	\$5,000

Prior to the Museum's opening, gifts of \$50,000 or more will confer major donor status on all donors and activate commensurate Circles of Distinction benefits, while eligible service organizations donating less than \$50,000 will also be listed on the Veterans Hall donor wall.

Recognizing Fund Donors

The names of the corporations, foundations, and service organizations making contributions to the National Museum of the United States Army Defender's Fund will be recognized on the society's Donor Wall.


