

The Army Historical Foundation Gallery Recognition Opportunities


COLD WAR GALLERY

Gallery Highlights

COLD WAR GALLERY (1945-1991)

The *Cold War Gallery* recounts a time when the United States faced numerous global challenges during the Cold War. American Soldiers manned a defensive line in Europe that deterred a potential attack, while on the other side of the world, the U.S. Army fought wars in Korea and Vietnam.





This gallery also features a glimpse at the representation of the U.S. Army Europe headquarters in Heidelberg, Germany. (Above) an immersive, mediabased show demonstrating the Army's preparedness for defending our allies from an attack by the Warsaw Pact is an impactful part of the gallery experience.

Soldiers' Stories Kiosks

Kiosks are stationed throughout the Museum with personal stories from Soldiers involved in the respective conflict. These kiosks connect to the central theme of the Museum by providing visitors the opportunity to experience the personal accounts of American Soldiers. The *Cold War Gallery* includes several kiosks that tell stories from Europe, Korea, and Vietnam. The kiosks featuring stories from the Korean War is pictured right.
